Lunch Bunch





SLAM: Quick Tips to Help Spot

Scam Emails

Who of us has not received strange requests to send money, claim award winnings connect with a too good to be true opportunity?

The predators that send the scams via email seem to keep reinventing ways to take advantage of even the most savy internet user.

So what do you do when you receive something that looks like a scam or phishing email, yet we are not quite sure...

We SLAM!

SLAM stands for **Sender**, **Links**, **Attachments**, **and Message**, and is a method to help identify and avoid phishing attempts in emails.

- Sender: Scrutinize the sender's email address for misspellings or unusual domains.
- Links: Hover over links to check the destination URL before clicking.
- Attachments: Be cautious with unexpected attachments, especially from unknown senders, as they may contain malware.
- Message: Evaluate the message for suspicious urgency, poor grammar, or requests for sensitive information.

2026 Stewardship Campaign Letter

As we look toward the close of this year, I want to share a brief update to our 2026 stewardship campaign and 2025 budget.

We faced some unexpected challenges this year, including a significant insurance increase. Thanks to your quick response and our staff's strong stewardship of expenses, we have remained on solid footing. However, as I shared during worship last Sunday, fourthquarter giving has softened. Without a strong December, we face a small year-end shortfall that will affect how boldly we can plan for ministry in 2026.

Our 2026 Stewardship Campaign invites us to Love Boldly, Serve Joyfully, and Lead Courageously. To help us plan for 2026, we've built three budget scenarios:

- Maintain \$784,287: continues our current mission and ministries.
- Grow \$809,646: includes new classroom chairs, staff salary equity, a small part-time position, and refreshed paint and carpet throughout the building.
- Dream \$1,107,291: expands staff, increases our monthly tithe, enhances outreach, and updates key building systems such as the elevator and fire alarms.

Pledges are the most important component of our budget process. So far, two-thirds of pledges have been returned and with onethird of pledges still outstanding, we are currently on track to propose the "Maintain" budget. We recognize the economic difficulties some members are facing even as the needs of our mission partners grow. Please know that we support you as many others have committed to increasing their giving.

Our challenge and invitation:

- Help us finish 2025 on budget by thoughtfully considering your December giving.
- Please return your 2026 pledge in the next two weeks—online through Vanco, by calling the office, or by stopping by the Gathering Space for a pledge card.
- Most importantly, pray about how God is calling you to support our shared ministry in the year ahead.

Thank you for the many ways you embody Christ's Love in this community. Together, we can move into 2026 with Joy, Courage and trust in God's abundance.

THREE GIFTS CAMPAIGN

Each year during the Christmas Season, the Missions Team offers an opportunity to give to a local, national, or international cause. This year we have chosen:

LOCAL: Colorado Feeding Kids is an all-volunteer organization which provides food to those in need. Smoky Hill has had a relationship with them for over eight years, and congregation members take part in their monthly food packs.

NATIONAL: Pine Ridge Reservation is in the poorest county in the United States. Unemployment is near 85% and teen suicide numbers are astounding. The life expectancy is the lowest in the United States. SHUMC has taken teams to Pine Ridge to learn more about their culture and life on the reservation. Your donations will go directly to support programs on the Pine Ridge Reservation.

INTERNATIONAL: Support for Florence Mefor. SHUMC has sponsored the missionary work of Dr. Emmanuel and Florence Mefor in Zimbabwe Africa for many years. One of their major projects is the mother and child survival program. They house 40-60 at risk pregnant women each day to ensure a safe delivery of their baby. Dr. Mefor has retired, but Florence is continuing her work with the women. Your support allows them to continue to offer pre-natal care and improve the survival rate of mothers and children.

Financial gifts can be made out to SHUMC, with "Three Gifts" or the specific organization name in the memo.

The Heifer Project

Once again, Smoky Hill will support the Alternative Gift program for the Heifer Project. Heifer International is a global nonprofit working to eradicate poverty and hunger. Heifer distributes animals along with training to families in need around the world as a means of providing self-sufficiency. Recipients must agree to "pass on the gift" by sharing animal offspring, as well as training with other impoverished families. You may "purchase" an animal in honor of a loved one this holiday season. The Mission Team has holiday cards available indicating your gift. We will be in the Gathering Space during the month of December. Stop by, help a family in need, and do some holiday shopping.


The Giving Tree
