Just know each of you were so helpful.


We can do this as a team and spread duties, meal planning, and programs around.



- **Destroyed firearm parts are transformed into garden tools, jewelry, and art separately from this event
- You remain anonymous
- No ammunition accepted .
- Homemade guns will be accepted and destroyed, but not compensated for

RACIAL JUSTICE TASK FORCE

Racism in Our Own Backyard

What would you do if going to church put your family at risk? Imagine wanting to worship on Sunday, to find peace and healing in your faith community, but feeling too afraid to walk through the church doors. This is the reality for some of our own neighbors—and some of our own church family.

As a longtime member of Smoky Hill United Methodist Church and a participant in our Rainbow Alliance and Racial Justice Task Force, I've always believed in combining Jesus' ministry of love and compassion with the hard work of justice. I know I carry my own biases and flaws—none of us is perfect—but I try to meet people, even those who do harm, with love. Still, a recent injustice has made me mad like no other issue has before: that members of our Spanish-speaking congregation are afraid to attend worship because of the threat of ICE raids and deportation.

It breaks my heart—and makes my blood boil—that in 2025, in the United States of America, people are too frightened to go to church. For many of us, Sunday worship is where we come to be uplifted and reminded of God's grace. But our Hispanic brothers and sisters, who may need that comfort even more right now, often feel they cannot safely attend. This is not the country I believed I was growing up in. Religious freedom is a foundational value. How can we sit comfortably in our worship while others stay away out of fear?

Latinx people make up at least 60% of ICE detainees. Black immigrants, while only 5% of the undocumented population, make up 20% of those detained. As of June 2025, nearly three-quarters of those in ICE custody have no criminal record. This is a moral failure. And as followers of Christ, we cannot look away.

So, what can we do?


- **Contact your elected officials.** Demand policies that uphold dignity, family unity, and religious freedom.
- **Bring food or supplies** to support our Spanish-speaking congregants who may be too frightened to go to the grocery store or even work.
- Volunteer for parking lot duty. While it's unlikely ICE would target a church, your presence can offer a sense of safety and solidarity.
- And most importantly, pray. Pray for wisdom, courage, and compassion—for ourselves, our leaders, and every neighbor made to feel like a stranger in their own community.

Let us be the church we claim to be: one rooted in love, justice, and the fearless welcome of Christ.

The Denver Concert Band is comprised of 90 musicians who love instrumental music. These musicians are volunteers who rehearse and perform year-round throughout Colorado. Approximately 59 players will take the stage on July 20. Jacinda Bouton has been the band's Music Director since 1997. She is also the founding Conductor of the Lone Tree Symphony Orchestra and is an active conductor, clinician and adjudicator throughout the Rocky Mountain Region.

The DCB has four formal concerts, currently in the Lone Tree Arts Center. One of these concerts includes a guest artist, and another concert is dedicated to the year's Young Artist Scholarship winner. The band also has an active summer season, performing at venues such as Levitt Pavilion, the Historic Tabor Opera House, and Perry Park Country Club. Smaller groups perform in additional events like the Race for the Cure, and DCB's annual holiday performance at the Denver Health downtown campus.

As a non-profit organization, the DCB is also dedicated to musical education and enthusiasm. Our annual Young Artist Scholarship competition gifts a high-school senior with \$5000 towards their college education. The DCB's Show & Tell Band also performs at elementary schools to teach and promote interest in musical instruments.
